



Fair Tax Talking Points

- Instead of April 15, *every* day in Michigan will be tax day since a tax will be applied to virtually every sale, including services;
- Sales tax would be imposed on food, prescription drugs, homes sales and it could automatically increase without a vote by voters or lawmakers;
- Seniors won't benefit from the termination of the 4.35 percent Michigan income tax because most pay no state income tax due to exemptions. Instead they will have to pay sales tax on health care, prescriptions and food, all now tax-exempt;
- Residential property taxes would not be repealed, and they could effectively go up because of the possible elimination of the Homestead Property Tax Credit.
