Action on Federal Stimulus Package

A significant portion of the stimulus money coming to Michigan must be appropriated by the Legislature in order for it to be used. This is a summary of the money that has been appropriated so far through the legislative process.

PUBLIC ACT 3 WAS SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR ON MARCH 31, 2009	
This Public Act allocates stimulus transportation infrastructure funds apportioned to Michigan by formula, specifically for highway infrastructure, and nonurbanized area formula (rural) transit grants, including related intercity bus program funds.	Total: \$873 million
