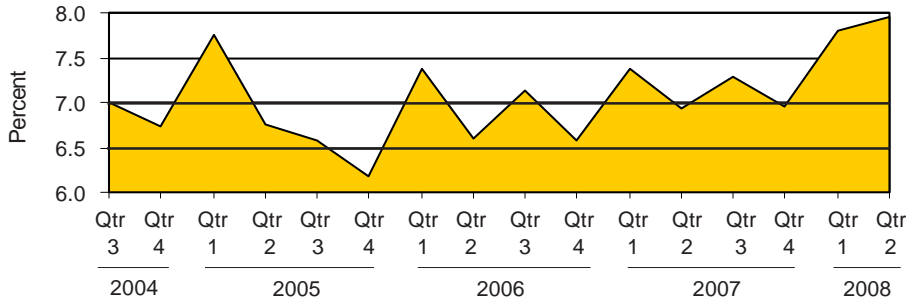


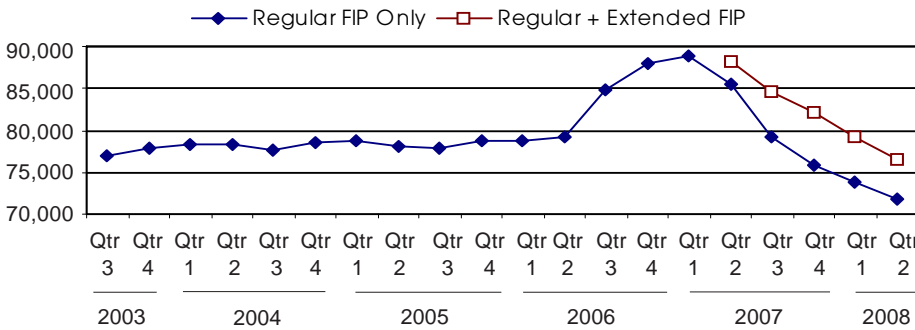


Michigan's Unemployment Rate

(not seasonally adjusted)



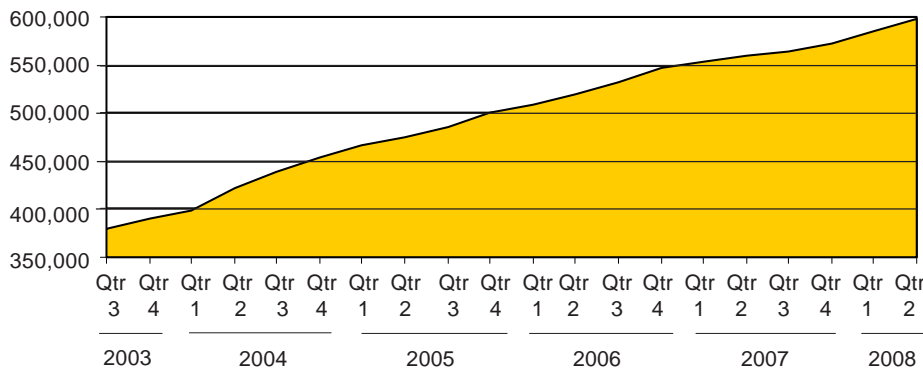

Unemployment

Michigan's unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) went from 6.9 percent in April to 8.5 percent in both May and June of this year, making those the worst two months for the state since January 1993 (8.7%). To put this in recent historical perspective, during several months in 1991-1992 it surpassed 10 percent, and from 1980 through most of 1985 it remained at 10 percent and above, reaching 16.9 percent in November 1982.

Public Assistance

The number of Food Assistance households peaked at more than 600,000 during June 2008. This is not surprising, given the upward trend of usage of this benefit over the past several years and the recent climb in unemployment levels. However, the number of families receiving Family Independence Program (FIP) cash assistance during the past several quarters has consistently decreased. This is seen to be due to the increased use of sanctions imposed on recipients who are found to be noncompliant, and to a policy change that requires families applying for FIP to go to their local Michigan Works! Agency before becoming enrolled in FIP (previous policy required the Department of Human Services to assess recipients before their orientation into work activities.) It is also possible that a decrease in Medicaid usage, due to a new federal requirement that Medicaid recipients show proof of citizenship, has affected FIP enrollment.

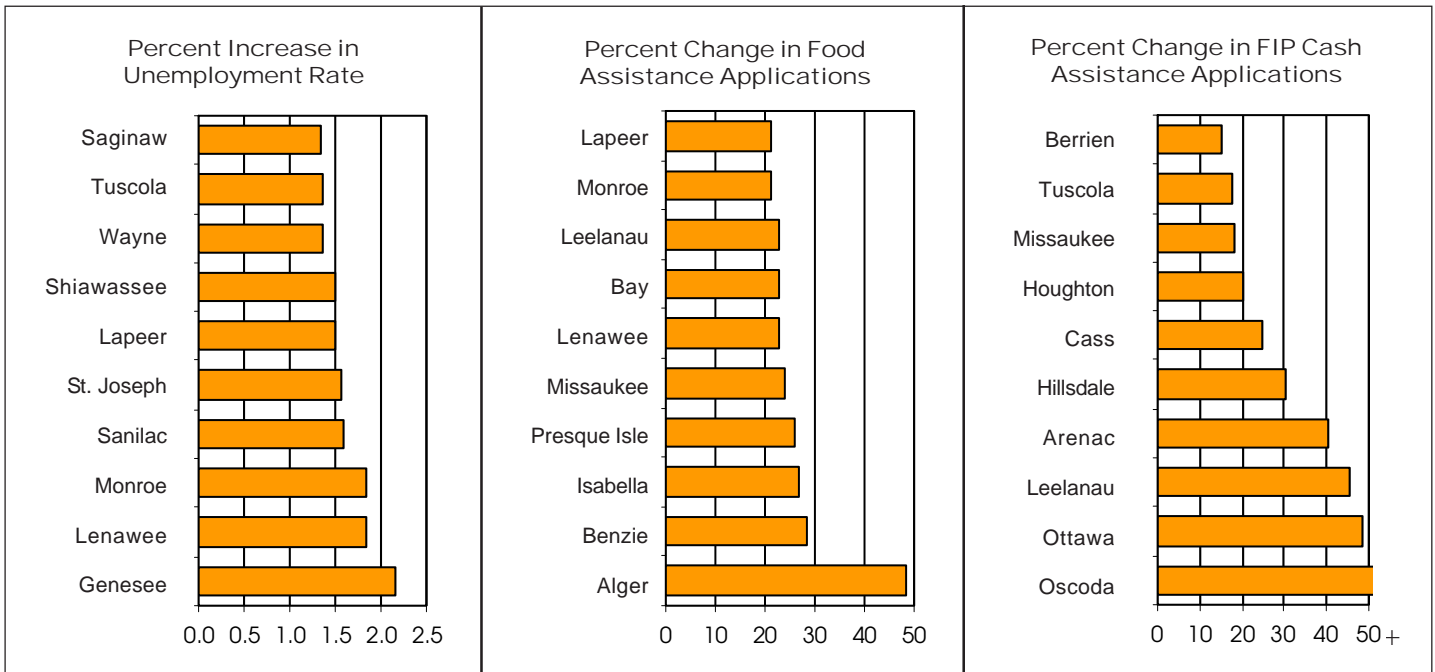
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Percentage Change in Michigan Counties With Largest Increases
