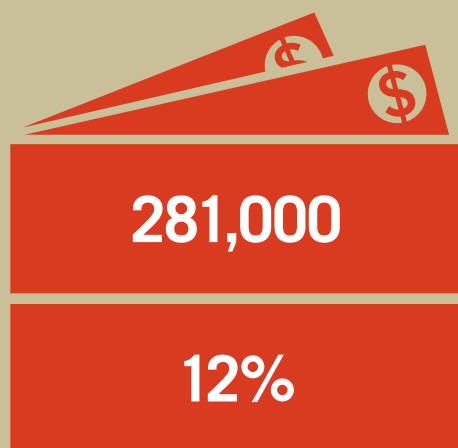


Michigan

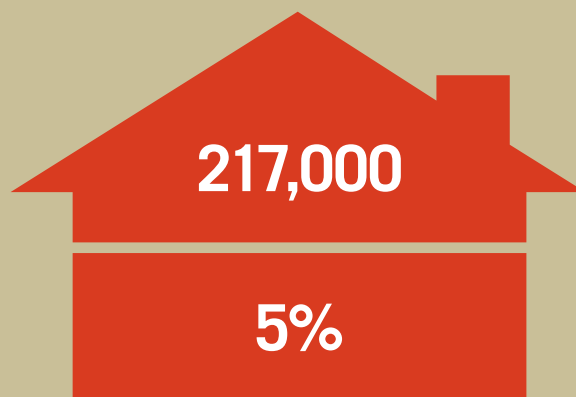
